



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FACTS: LOUISIANA



DID YOU KNOW?

- ◇ **One in every four women** will experience domestic violence in her lifetime.¹ **One in 33 men** have experienced an attempted or completed rape.²
- ◇ An estimated **1.3 million women** are victims of physical assault by an intimate partner each year.³
- ◇ The majority (73%) of family violence victims are female. Females were 84% of spousal abuse victims and 86% of abuse victims at the hands of a boyfriend.⁴
- ◇ The cost of intimate partner violence **exceeds \$5.8 billion each year**, \$4.1 billion of which is for direct medical and mental health services.⁵
- ◇ Boys who witness domestic violence are **twice as likely** to abuse their own partners and children when they become adults.⁶

CHALLENGES

- Hurricanes Katrina and Rita caused economic hardship on funding, in particular, the Governor's Office on Women's Policy's budget, 87% of which goes towards funding for local programs that fight domestic violence, and was cut by over \$200,000.⁷
- Lack of public transportation, particularly in rural areas, makes it difficult for victims of domestic violence in Louisiana to access the help and safety they need.⁷
- Louisiana's domestic abuse battery law includes only opposite-sex partners who are currently living, or have previously lived, in the same residence.⁸

"We built a safe, nurturing school for children of battered women residing in our shelter where, with the support of the community, the students excelled academically and were safe. Then, in December 2004, an act passed as part of No Child Left Behind stated that children in shelters cannot be separated from regular school settings, and we had to close the school."

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT IN LOUISIANA

- In 2005, 8,686 women and 4,607 children received domestic violence services from non-residential programs or in residential shelters in Louisiana.⁷
- More than 3,500 orders for protection were issued in 2005.⁷
- 1,562 forcible rapes were reported in Louisiana in 2006.⁸
- In 2005, Louisiana had the third highest number of females murdered by males in the nation.⁹
 - ◇ 84% of the female victims in Louisiana who were murdered by males knew their offender.⁹
 - ◇ 20 of those victims were wives, common-law wives, ex-wives, or girlfriends of the offender.⁹
 - ◇ 58% were killed with a firearm.⁹
